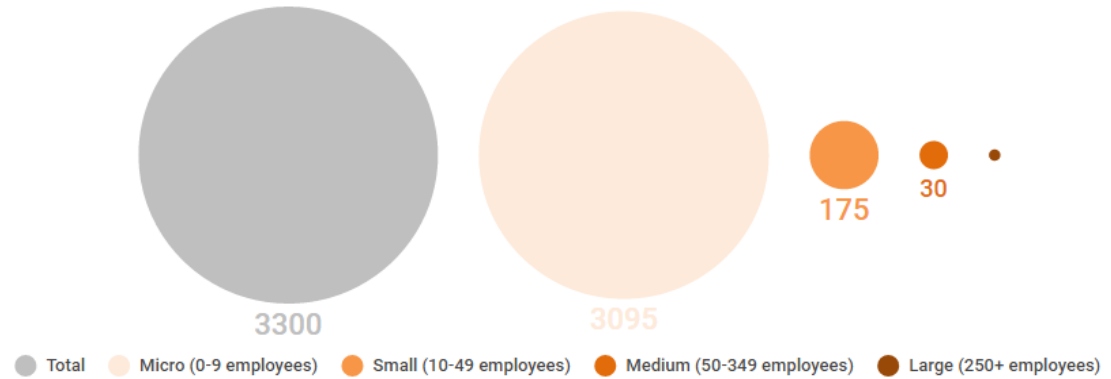

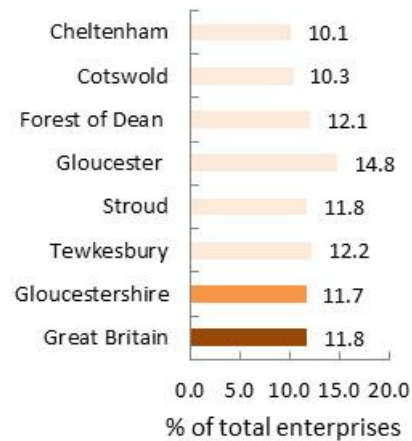

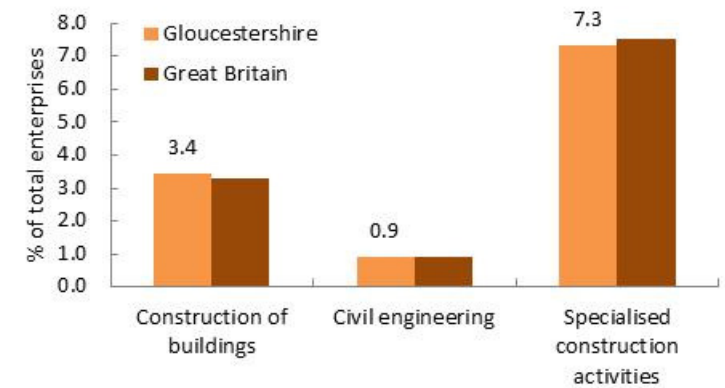
Gloucestershire Construction enterprises by size

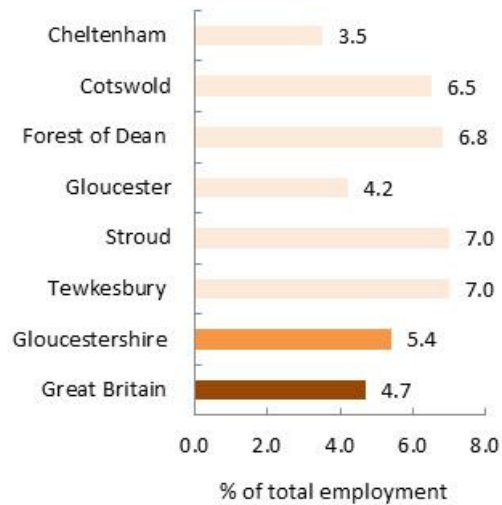

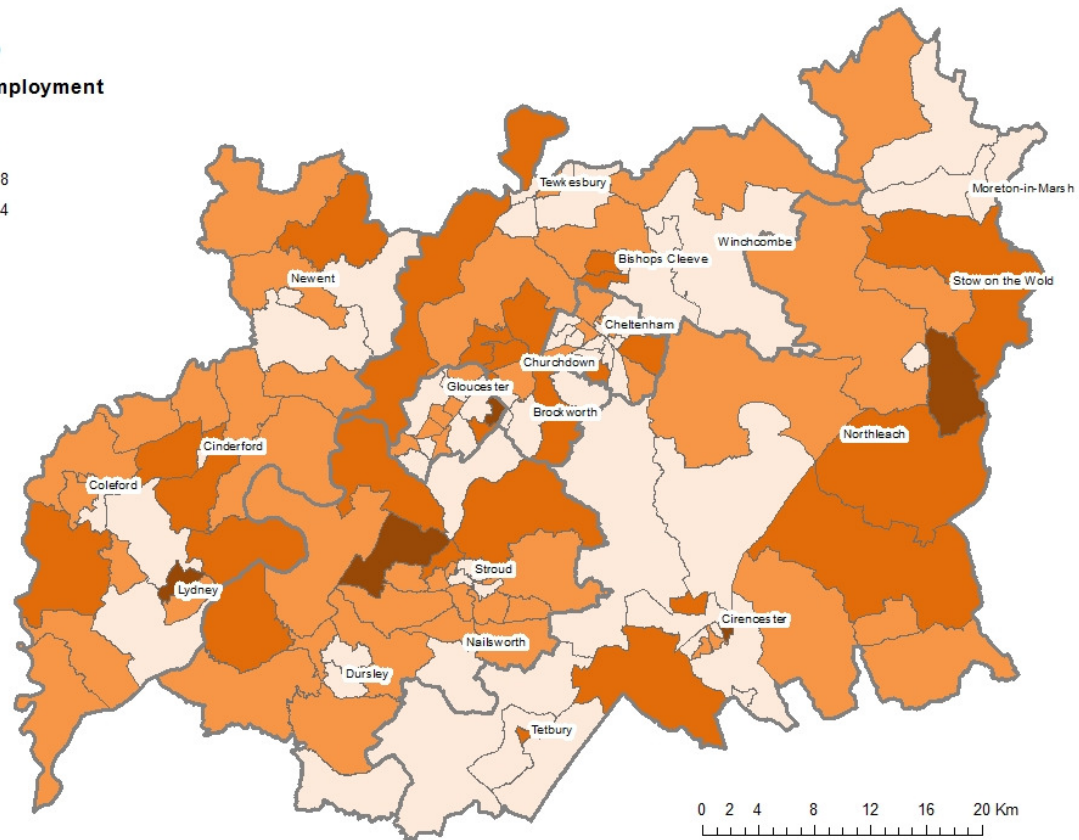
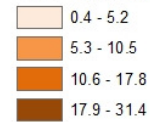
Construction employment by local authority area

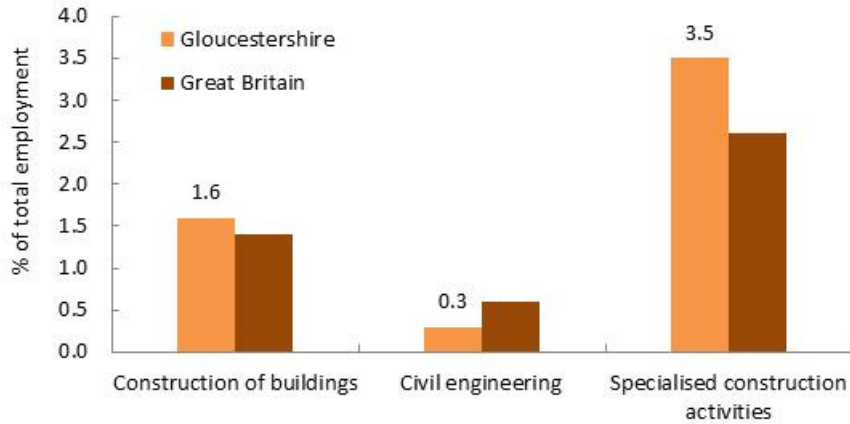

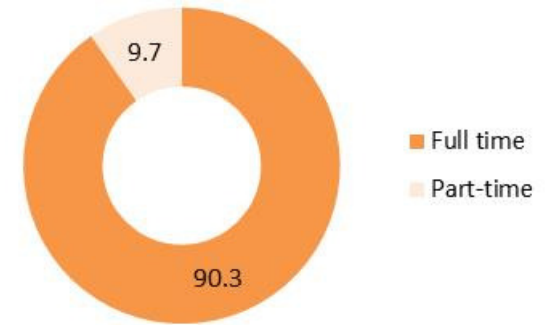

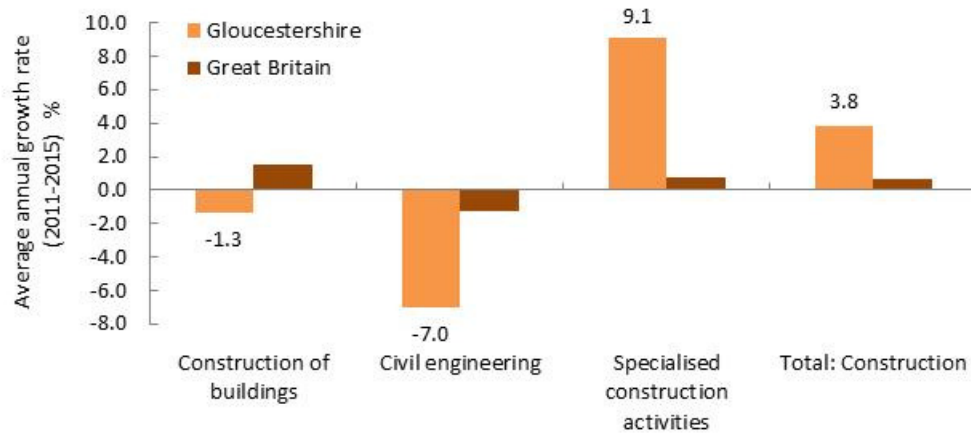
Construction employment by sub-sector, Gloucestershire and Great Britain



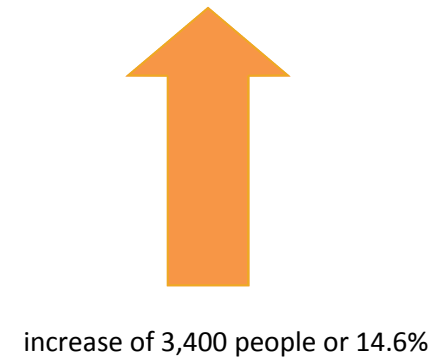
Employment status in the Construction sector

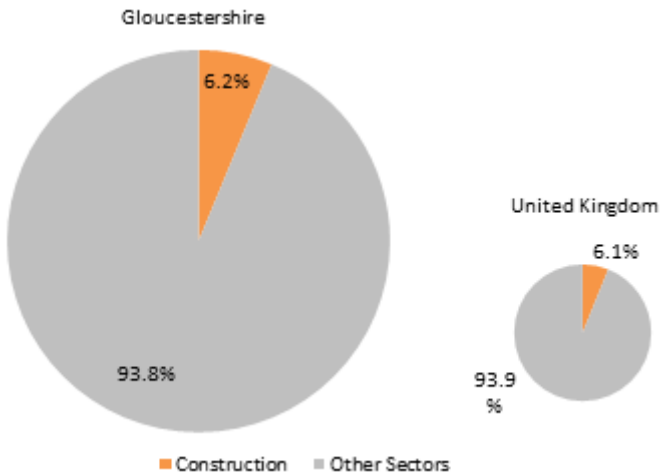

The sector is estimated to be worth £0.997 billion to the Gloucestershire economy.

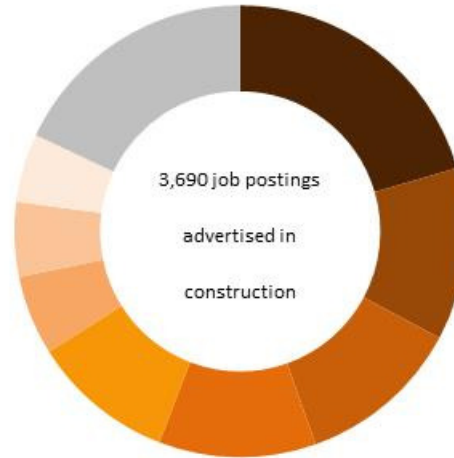
Contribution of the construction sector to GVA



Regional Gross Value Added (Income Approach) (2015)

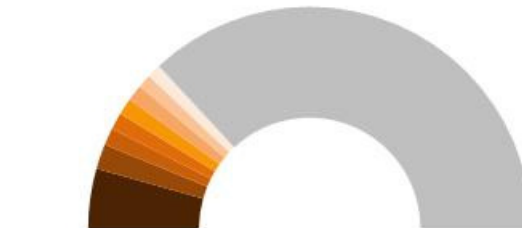

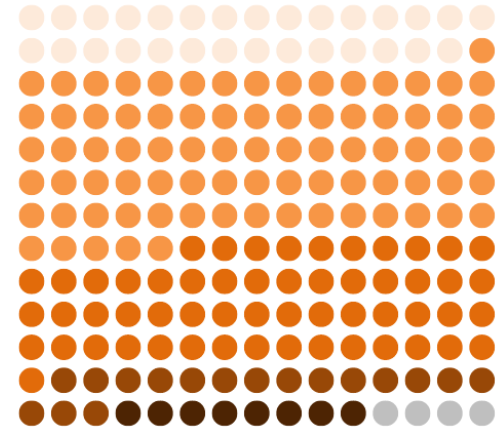
