Long-term social care funded services used by over-65s

Key trends

According to snapshot data as at 31 March 2018 and 31 March 2020:

- ❖ The overall number of over-65s receiving long-term social care services funded by Gloucestershire County Council has fallen from 3,001 to 2,742 people, representing a reduction of 8.6%.
- ❖ The number decreased across all age groups, with the 65-74s showing the biggest drop, by 12.6%. This was followed by the 75-84s (dropped by 8.5%) and the over-85s (by 7.3%).
- ❖ The number also fell across community care, residential care and nursing care settings, by 10.1%, 6.0% and 8.1% respectively over the period.

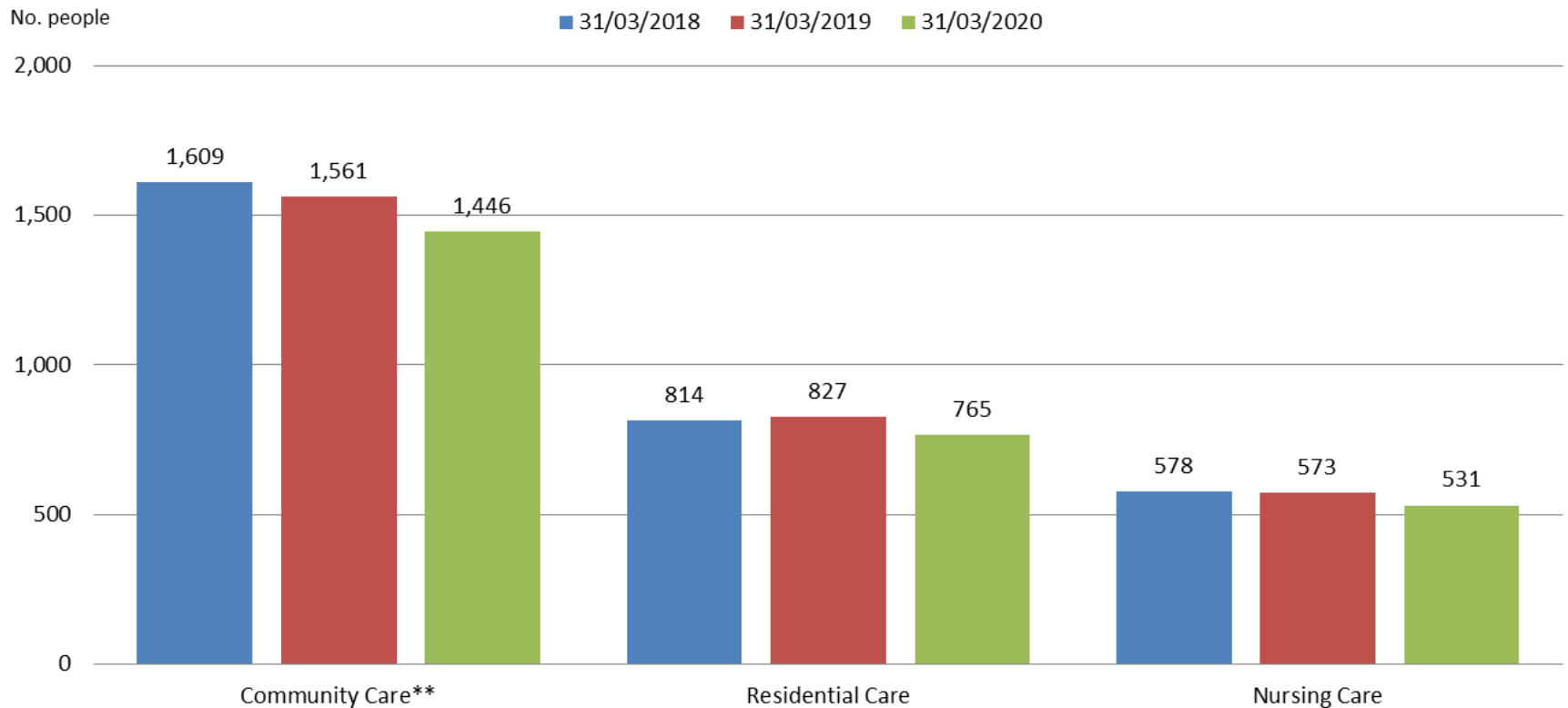
Snapshot data as at 31 March 2020 shows that:

- ❖ A total of 2,742 adults aged 65+ in Gloucestershire were receiving long-term care packages. Of these 52.7% were receiving community care services, 27.9% residential care and 19.4% nursing care.
- ❖ Those aged 85 and over accounted for half of the demand for long-term social care, totalling 1,363 people, i.e. 49.7%.
- ❖ This was followed by the 75-84s (927 people, 33.8%) and those aged 65-74 (452 people 16.5%).

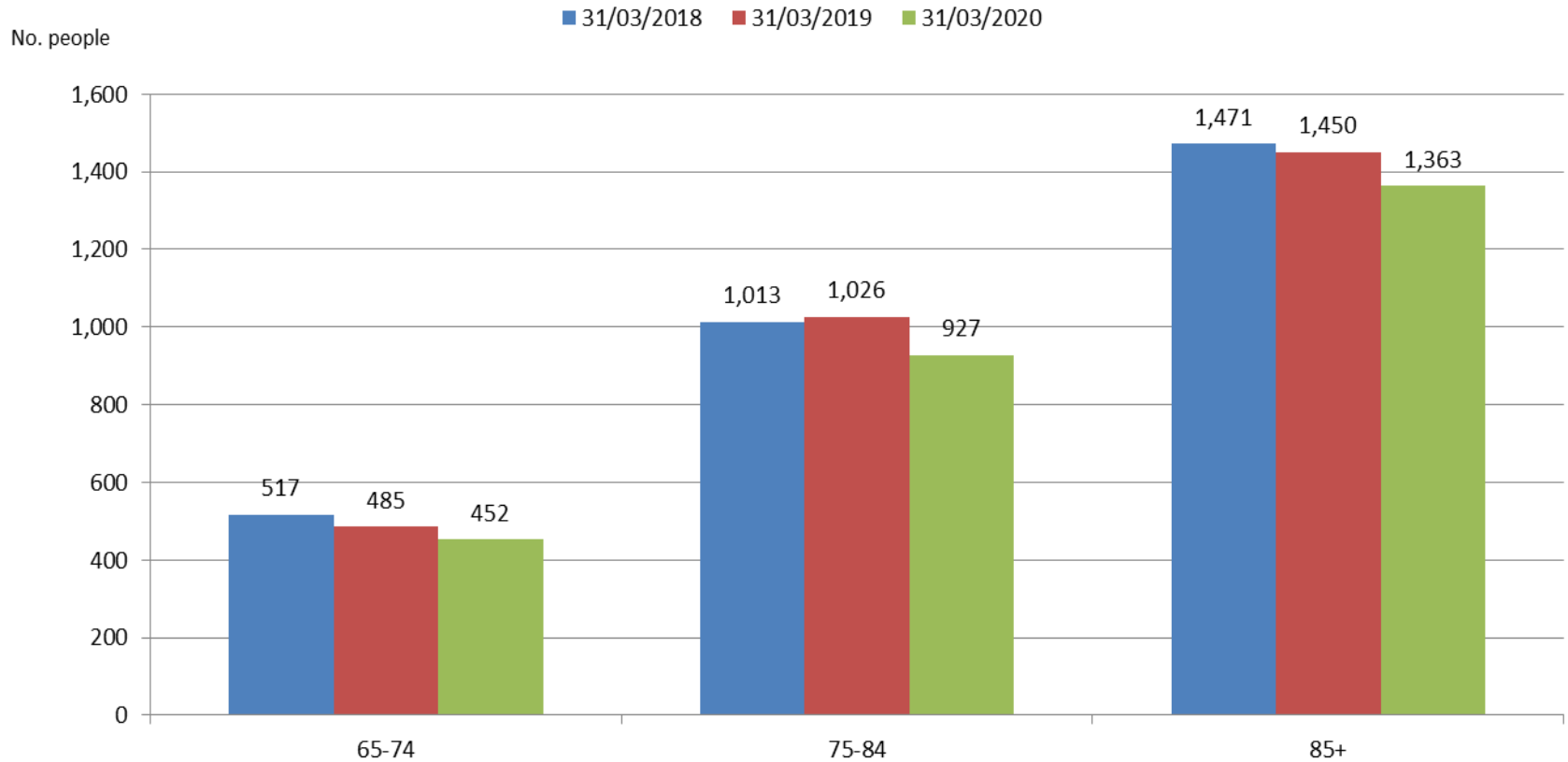

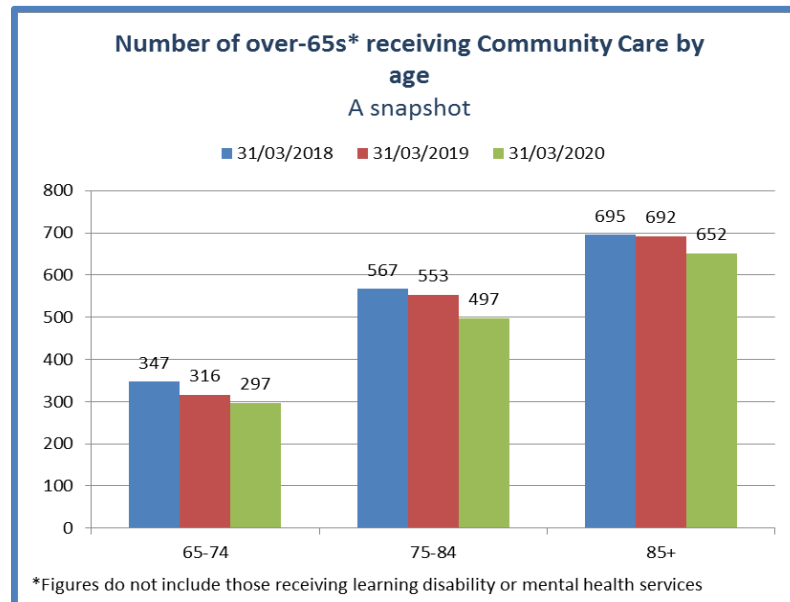
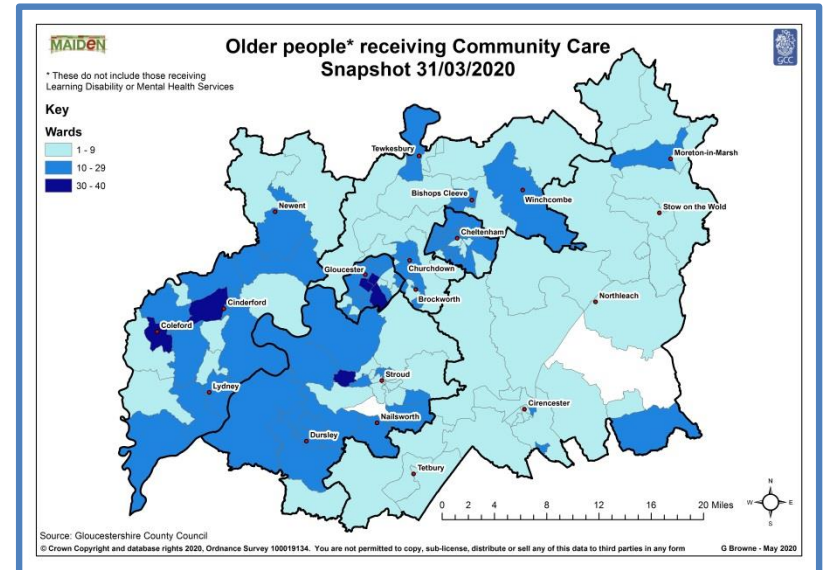
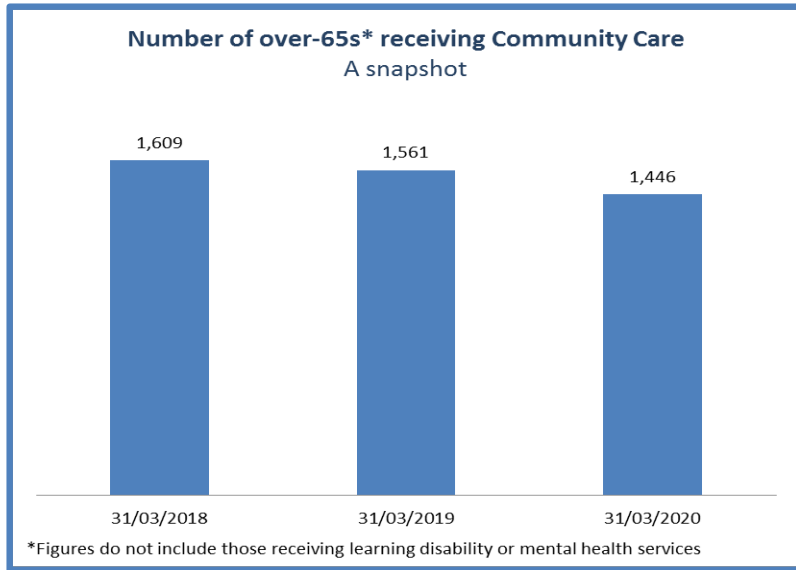
Long-term social care services used by over-65s* by age A snapshot



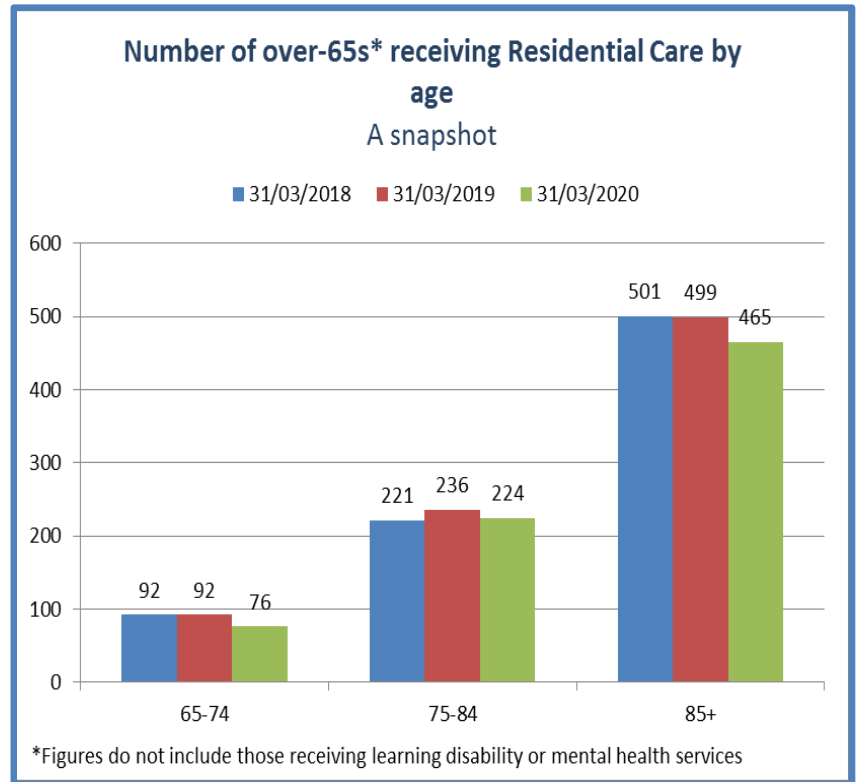
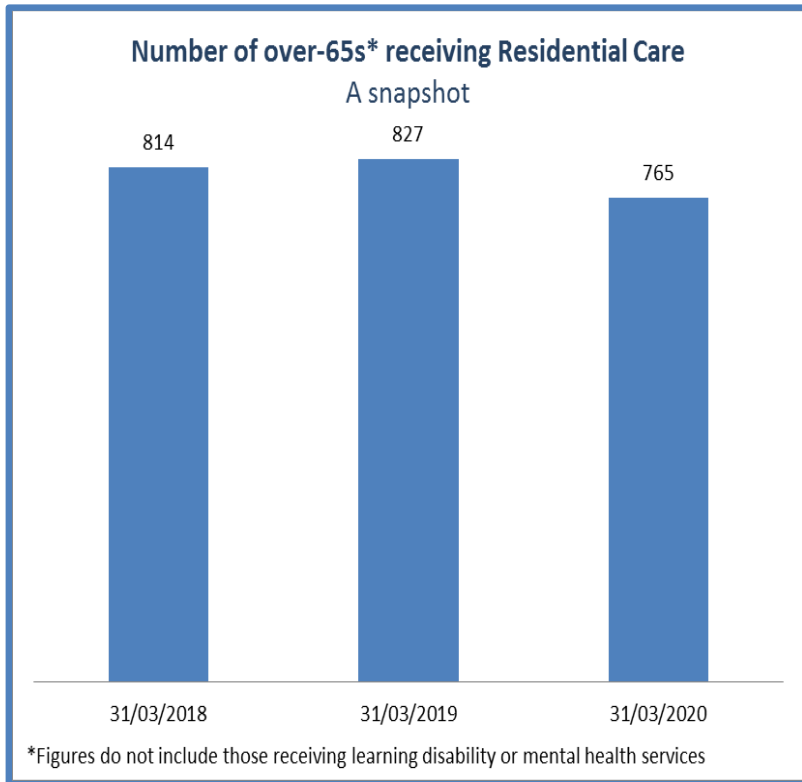

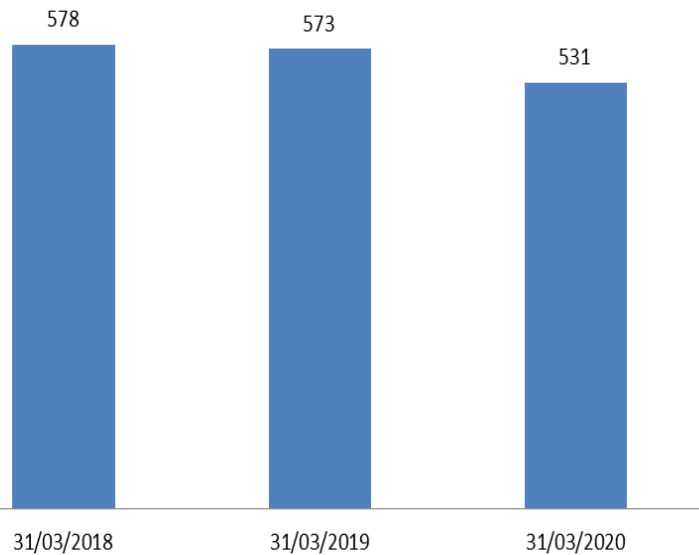

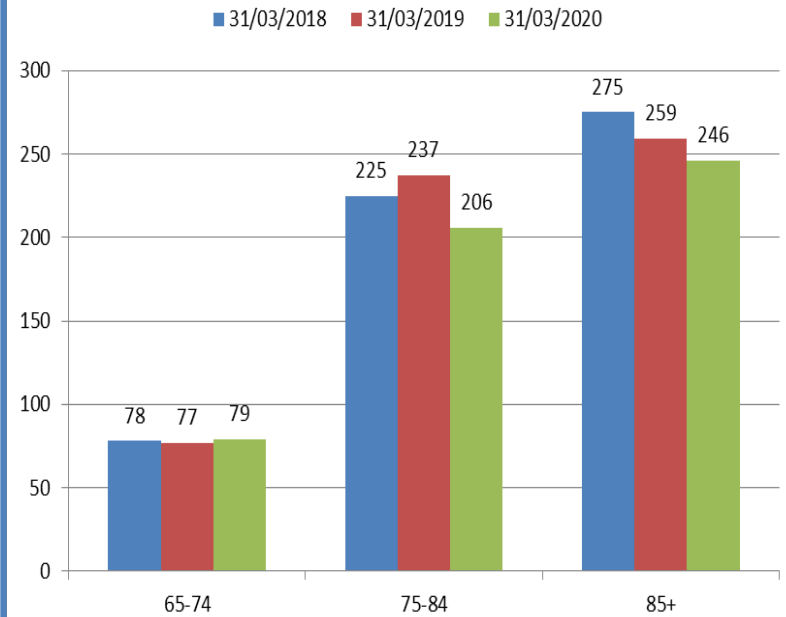
Nursing Care
