Long-term social care funded services used by adults aged under 65 with a physical disability

Key trends

According to snapshot data as at 31 March 2018 and 31 March 2020:

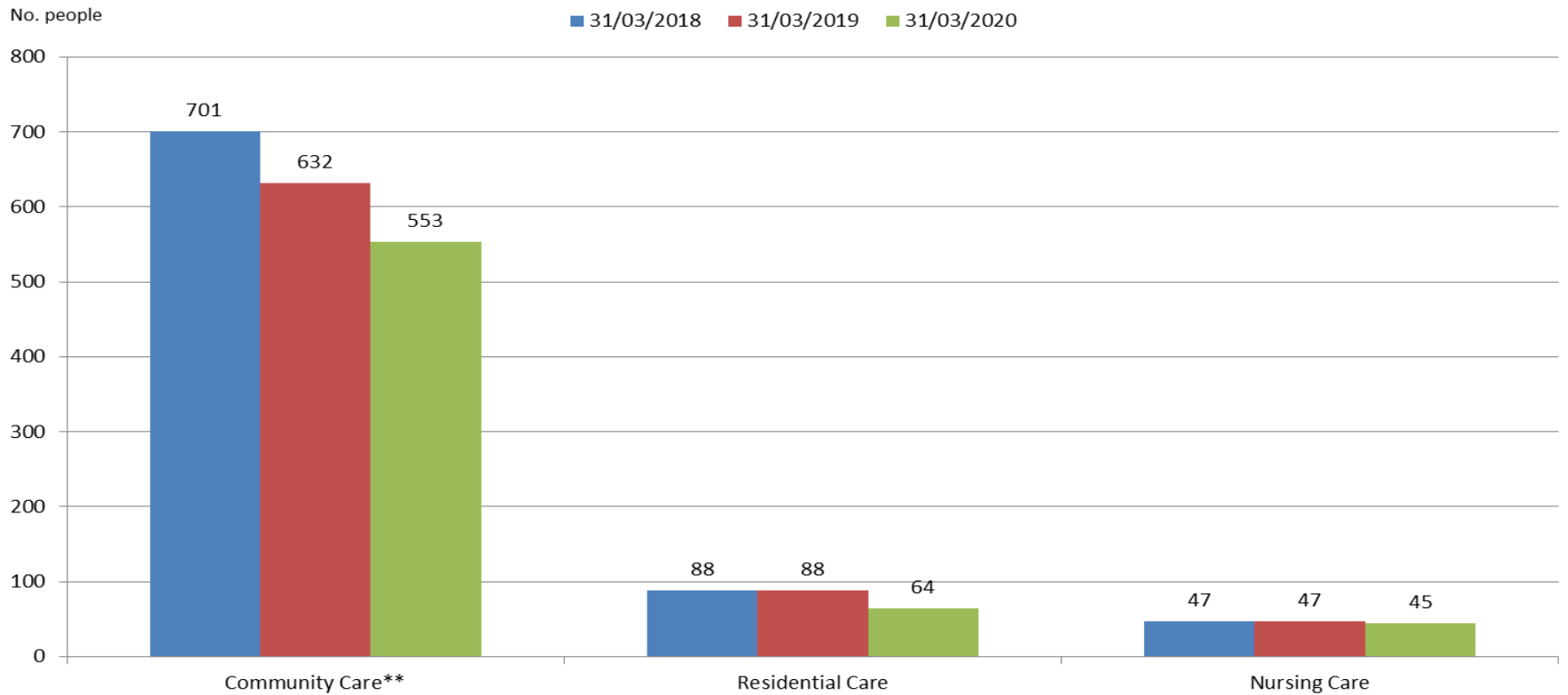
- ❖ The overall number of adults aged under 65 with a physical disability receiving long-term care funded by Gloucestershire County Council fell by 20.8% (i.e. from 836 to 662 people) between the above two dates.
- ❖ The number fell across residential care, community care and nursing care settings, by 27.3%, 21.1% and 4.3% respectively.
- ❖ The decrease also occurred across all age groups, with the biggest decrease in number being in the 45-64 age group, reducing from 499 to 412 people in the period.
- ❖ In terms of rate, however, the number of under-25s had the largest drop, having reduced by 37.1% between the two dates.

Snapshot data as at 31 March 2020 shows that:

- ❖ A total of 662 adults under the age of 65 in Gloucestershire were receiving long-term care packages for a physical health condition. Of these 83.5% were receiving community care services.
- ❖ Among all service users aged under 65 with a physical disability, the 45-64 age group was the largest group receiving long-term care services (412 people), accounting for 62.2% of all users.
- ❖ This was followed by those aged 25-44 (211 people, 31.9%). The under-25s accounted for 5.9% of all users (39 people).

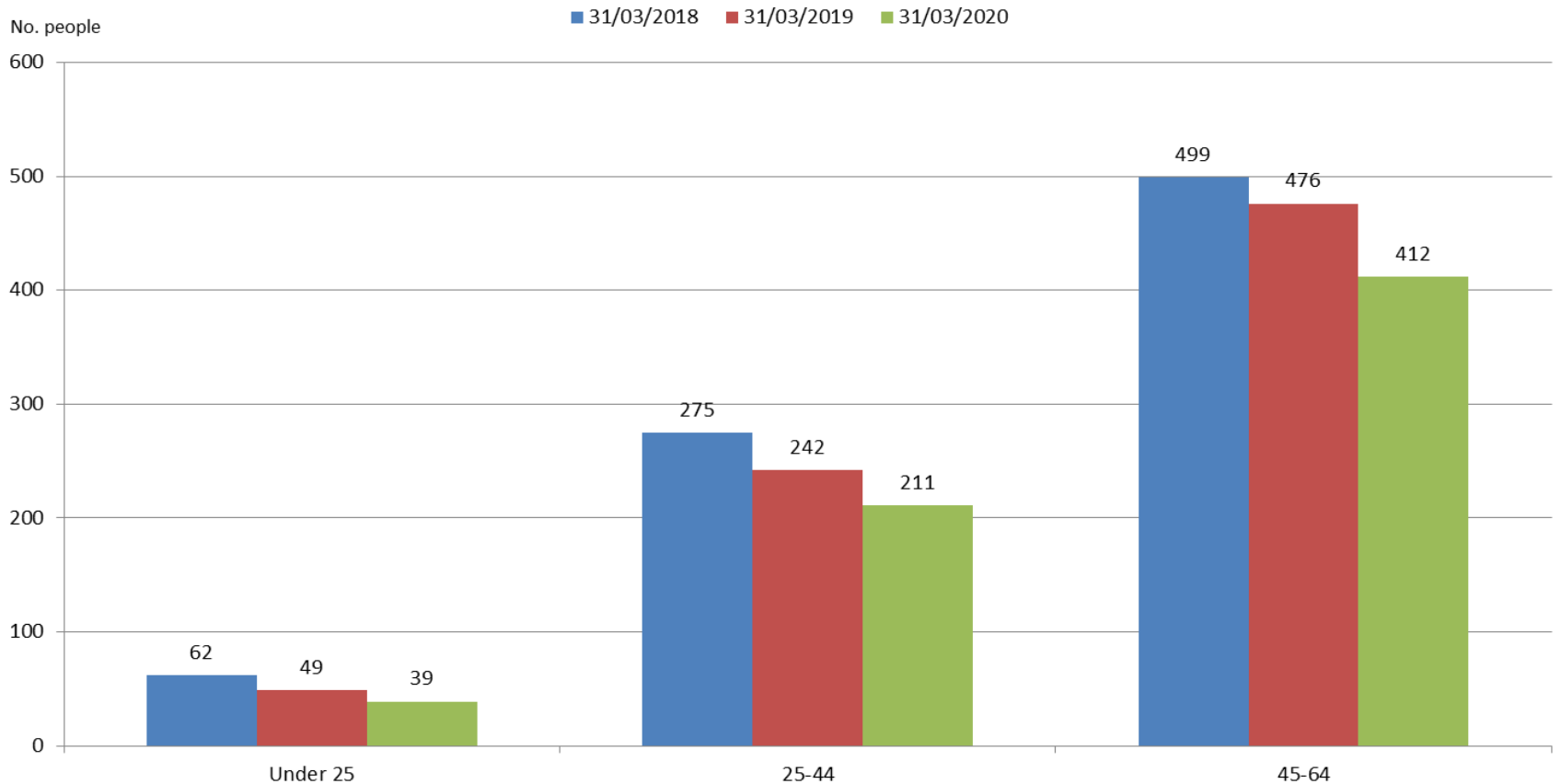

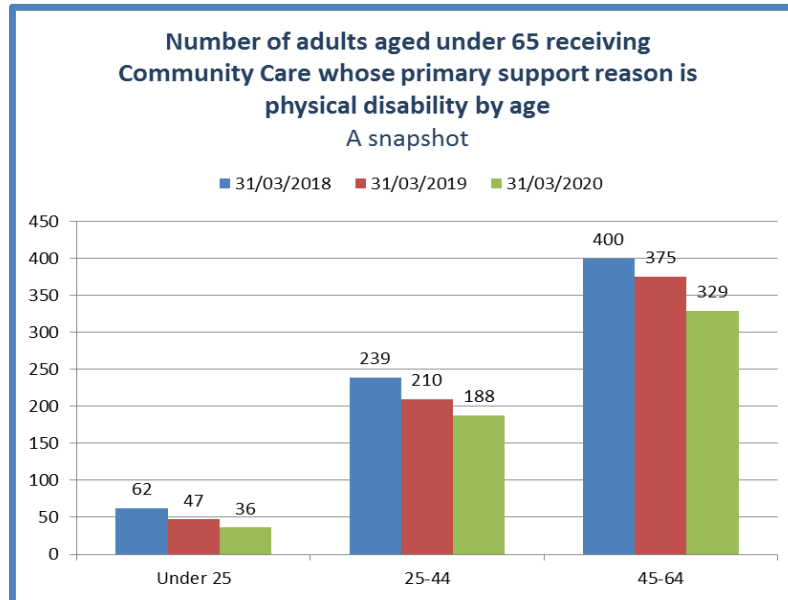
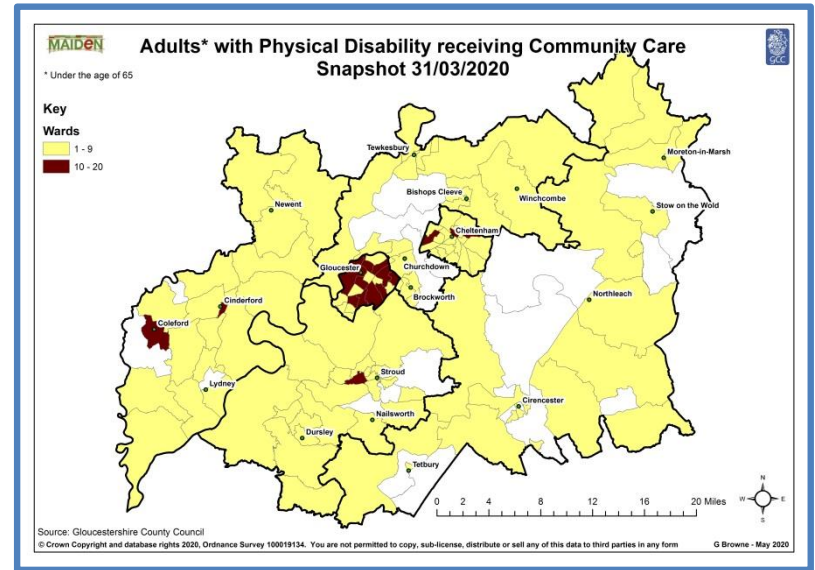
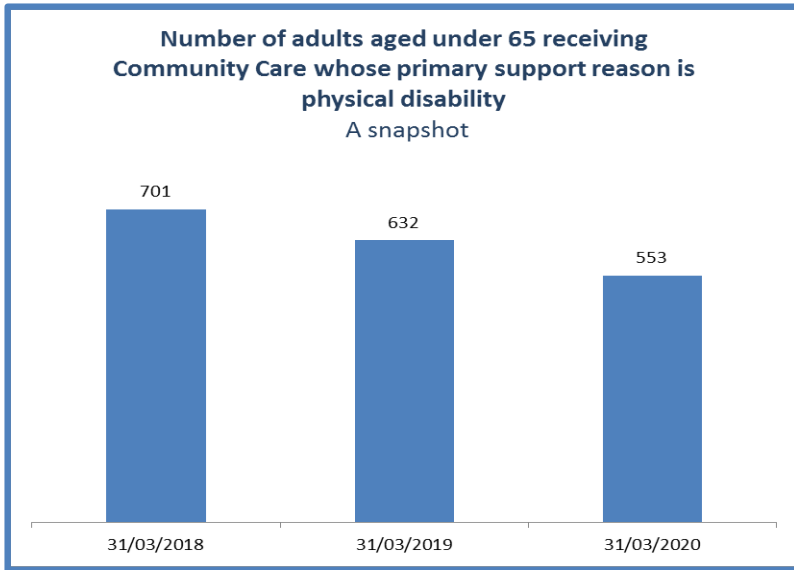

Long-term social care services used by adults aged under 65 with a physical disability by age A snapshot



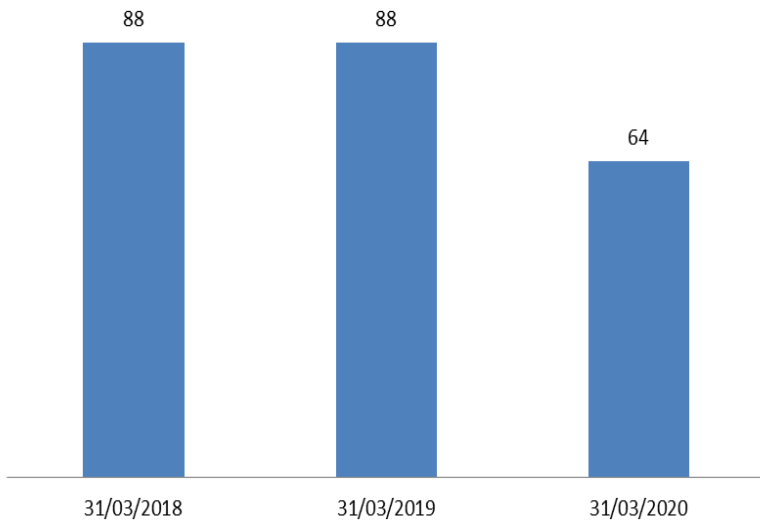

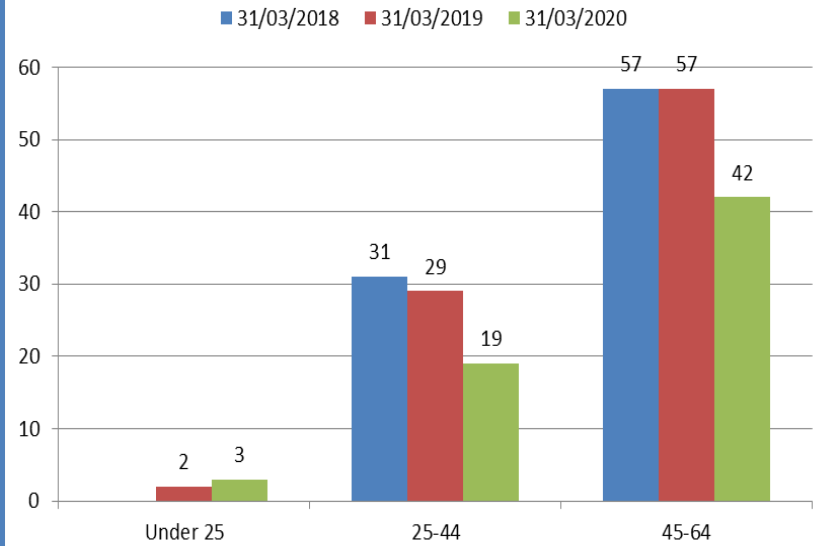


Residential Care

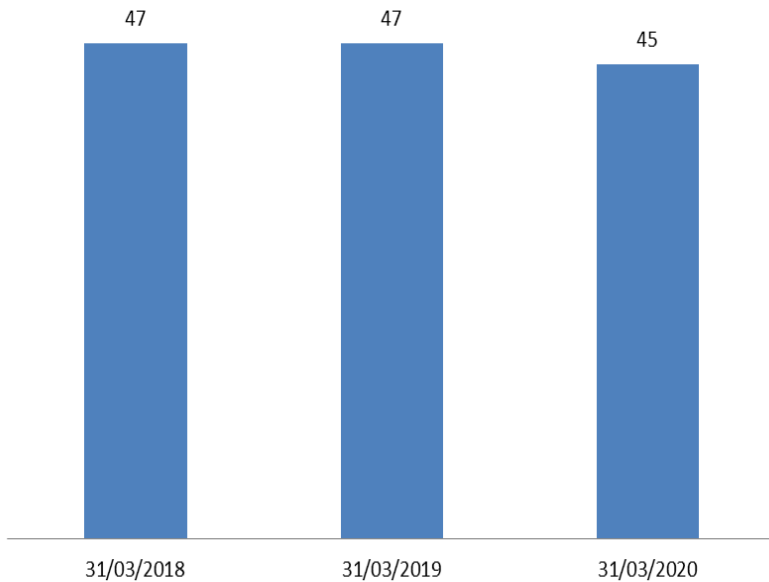


Number of adults aged under 65 receiving Residential Care whose primary support reason is physical disability by age
